WHAT'S FENTANYL?

IT'S AN OPIOID THAT'S: • Extremely potent

- Odorless
- Tasteless
- Very often laced into pills and powders
- The leading cause of accidental overdose deaths in Georgia



HOW TO SAVE A LIFE

- 1 CALL 911: There are laws in place to protect people who overdose and people who call for help
- 2 GIVE NALOXONE: Administer it immediately
- 3 START RESCUE BREATHING: Do this until help arrives
- 4 STAY BY THE VICTIM'S SIDE: Even if they are breathing

NALOXONE SAVES LIVES

no breathing

CARRY NALOXONE:

not waking up

Lack of oxygen can damage the brain in less than 6 minutes. If you or someone you know takes opioids, pills, or powders of any kind, you should carry naloxone.

or snoring

HOW IT WORKS:

Naloxone restores breathing and oxygen flow.
