WHAT'S FENTANYL?

IT'S AN OPIOID THAT'S:

- Extremely potent
- Odorless
- Tasteless
- Very often laced into pills and powders
- The leading cause of accidental overdose deaths in Georgia



LEARN HOW TO IDENTIFY AN OVERDOSE



Sleep-like state
not waking up

Slowed or
no breathing

Heavy gurgling
or snoring

HOW TO SAVE A LIFE

- 1 **CALL 911:** There are laws in place to protect people who overdose and people who call for help
- 2 **GIVE NALOXONE:** Administer it immediately
- 3 **START RESCUE BREATHING:** Do this until help arrives
- 4 **STAY BY THE VICTIM'S SIDE:** Even if they are breathing

NALOXONE SAVES LIVES

CARRY NALOXONE:

Lack of oxygen can damage the brain in less than 6 minutes. If you or someone you know takes opioids, pills, or powders of any kind, you should carry naloxone.

HOW IT WORKS:

Naloxone restores breathing and oxygen flow.



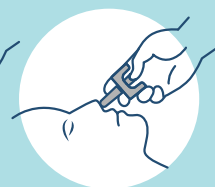
